English as a Second Language (E.S.L.) Class for Caregivers a Success in Esparto!

Twenty students graduated from Yolo County Library's ten-week E.S.L. Class for Caregivers on Friday, November 30th. The

special evening included a catered dinner, a mariachi band, a visit from the California State Library, a short ceremony with certificates, and heartfelt speeches from the new graduates. The California State Library and Dollar General provided grant funding to make this opportunity possible. **Nancy Pacheco** and **Elizabeth Gray** spearheaded this project for Yolo County Library.

Nine of our graduates enrolled in an E.S.L. course offered by Woodland Community College at the Esparto Regional Library. The class meets bi-weekly and runs through mid-December. Woodland Community College will be offering another E.S.L. class at the Esparto Regional Library this spring.

Yolo County Library Declares Victory with Ballot Drop Off Service for Local Residents



In partnership with the Yolo County Elections Office, Vote-By-Mail voters were able to drop off their completed ballots at Yolo County branch libraries in Davis, Esparto, West Sacramento and Winters from Friday, October 19th to Monday, November 5th.

For this election cycle, 1,972 ballots were dropped off at the four libraries, a 57% increase compared to the last election.
