





During the week of April 7-13, Yolo County Library joins libraries in celebrating the many ways libraries build strong communities by providing critical resources, programs and expertise.

National Library Week is an annual celebration highlighting the valuable role libraries, librarians and library workers play in transforming lives and communities. Libraries are at the heart of their cities, towns, schools and campuses.

Yolo County Library offers programs that encourage community connections. Families can learn about local resources, and strengthen their social and support networks through attending early literacy programs such as storytimes.

Community members can experiment and collaborate using new technologies like 3D printing or learn alongside one another in English Conversation Groups. Library staff also partner with other civic and service organizations to actively engage with the people they serve, always striving to make sure their community's core needs are being met.



In Remembrance: Barbara Wright

Barbara Wright, a former library employee passed away on March 20th. Barbara worked for Yolo County Library for seventeen years and retired in December 2006. She is remembered for her work as a Library Assistant at the old Winters Library.

"Barbara was a co-founder of the Woodland Parent Nursery School and active in the Beta Sigma Phi sorority and the Woodland Shakespeare Club. A lifelong learner, she enjoyed the intellectual stimulation offered by these organizations. She loved traveling and learning about things and places. She and her husband, Jim, traveled to many places in the world. Some of

her other interests included weaving, painting, cooking, and writing about her life. She valued her American heritage and embraced her Scottish heritage. After working as office manager in the family business, R&J Family Pharmacy, Barbara served as a Library Assistant for 17 years for Yolo County Library. An avid reader, this position was a dream come true. But most of all, Barbara enjoyed her family and long line of Siamese cats. She especially loved spending holidays with a house full of relatives.
