JOY HARJO (MUSCOGEE)

United States Poet Laureate

Appointed on June 19, 2019



Joy Harjo is the first Native American poet to serve as the United States Poet Laureate—she is an enrolled member of the Muscogee Creek Nation. Harjo is the author of nine books of poetry—including *In Mad Love and War* (811.54 HAR), which received an American Book Award and the Delmore Schwartz Memorial Award. Her memoir, *Crazy Brave* (B HARJO), won the 2013 PEN Center USA literary prize for creative nonfiction. Other books by Joy Harjo in the Yolo County Library collection include:
