Fall is upon us, leaves are changing colors and it is time to gear up for the Holiday Season. It has been a productive Summer for Yolo Reads. Yolo Reads staff has steadily attended literacy training over the summer. These were made possible by a grant for family literacy from California Library Literacy Services: Mother Goose on the Loose, "Play your way to Literacy and STEM"; "Starpower - Story times for Everyone! Adults as Partners in Developing Language and Literacy in Young Children", by Saroj Ghoting; and "Library Workshops to Go", presented by the National Center for Families Learning.

Essentially, all the workshops showed us how to use play in Library programs to build children's skills. This broadens our work with children and families to include building social and emotional skills in addition to literacy skills. We aim to give children opportunities to be successful and to give parents opportunities to see their children succeed. We will create opportunities for Yolo Reads Learners to interact in a fun way with their children while tackling early literacy concepts and socio-emotional skill-building.

SEPTEMBER 2019 IS LITERACY AWARENESS

WHEREAS, literacy consists of a set of skills that includes reading, writing, and critical thinking, whose mastery enables individuals to contribute to our economy, our democracy, and our community;

WHEREAS, adult learners come from all walks of life: co-workers, neighbors, friends and family members;

WHEREAS, over 32,000 of our Yolo County residents, or one in six adults, cannot read or write sufficiently to carry out everyday activities

WHEREAS, Yolo County has a tradition of commitment to literacy and lifelong learning; Yolo County Library invites you to celebrate Literacy month and the 35th Anniversary of Public Libraries' Literacy Programs in the State of California;

WHEREAS, Yolo Reads, the literacy program of the Yolo County Library, offers one-on-one tutoring and English Conver-

sation groups. During FY 2018-2019, Yolo Reads provided over 3,000 hours of free literacy instruction to 70+ Yolo County adults to help them improve their reading, writing, spelling, math, and grammar skills;

WHEREAS, 3 learners passed their GED, 7 passed their citizenship test; 6 found full-time employment; 15 enrolled in Woodland Community College; and, overall, learners completed 100+ goals that they set during FY 2018-2019;

WHEREAS, Yolo Reads is more than a program, it is a community of lifelong learners building a better future and coming together to celebrate their achievements each September;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors proclaims September as Literacy Awareness Month.

Writing Exercise by Yolo Reads Tutor, Phyllis Zerger

- o **Step One:** Ask your learner to talk about a topic of interest
- o **Step Two:** Write down verbatim what is said by your learner
After Step 2 it is important to read back to the learner what has been dictated. This is their first chance to make any corrections and also to hear it as the learner said it aloud. It is important not to skip this step.
- o **Step Three:** Ask learner if he or she would like to amend anything he or she said
- o **Step Four:** Go home and type up what your learner's response
- o **Step Five:** Next Tutor meeting discuss: grammar, sentence structure, spelling, principles of composition etc. This encourages lively discussion due to the fact they are reading their own words.


On the other hand, if you are tech-savvy, we'd love to have help with some digital literacy workshops for the Yolo Reads community.
