
## Summer Reading Program Winds Down in Mid-August Reading Takes You Everywhere

statewide selected to participate in this project. Workshops were held at the Yolo Branch Library on Friday, July 13<sup>th</sup> and Friday, July 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Sue Billing** and **Dana Christy** worked diligently to recruit participants and ensured the branch was well equipped for our nine storytellers; Andrea Spagat, West Coast Region Director for the StoryCenter and members of her staff; Dr. Milmon F. Harrison, Associate Professor, U.C. Davis African American and African Studies Department and a few of his students who assisted with the project.

Working both individually and collaboratively, the storytellers created nine outstanding and personal 2-4 minute digital stories. The workshop focused on writing and recording a short narration script, and then creating a basic visual treatment in an easy to use video editor. With each storyteller's consent, these stories will become part of the California State Library's collection.


A Yolo Reads learner testimonial:
