Personnel Updates

Maria Sandoval will be transitioning to a new, full-time Library Associate position at the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library. This transfer will allow her to oversee volunteers and the Library Pages in Davis and continue to work in programming and outreach at the Davis Migrant Center and with other Spanish-speaking communities.

We have started the recruitment process to hire a new Library Associate to oversee the Knights Landing Branch. Meanwhile, Maria will remain in Knights Landing until a replacement has been hired.

Miguel Perez will be joining our team as a full-time Library Assistant I at the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library. Miguel's work will include offering story times, assisting customers at the branch, and participating in community outreach efforts in Davis and the rural regions of Yolo County.

Miguel has extensive outreach and public service experience in Yolo County, and is proficient in communicating with local residents in English and Spanish. Over the last twenty years, Miguel has been employed as a landscaper, a Community Health Leader for the Health Education Council, Community Resource Specialist for Yolo County Children's Alliance, and a Public Assistance Specialist for Yolo County's Health and Human Services Agency. Miguel's first day with Yolo County Library will be October 1, 2018.

After an extensive search and a grueling interview process, which included stakeholders from Yolo Arts, the Yolo County Historical Museum, and the Friends of the Yolo County Archives, **Iulia Bodeanu** has been hired as our new full-time Museum Curator. This is a new two-year, limited-term position funded by Yolo County.



In this role, Iulia will engage in the review and deaccession of the County's historical collection, oversee the proper preservation and storage of the collection, generate awareness about the collection through countywide promotional efforts, design displays and exhibits in various county locations, and coordinate volunteer efforts to assist with these efforts.

Iulia has worked for Yolo County in various capacities since July 2016. She has museum-related experience working for the Pence Gallery in Davis, Verge Center for the Arts in Sacramento, former Heidrick Agriculture History Center in Woodland, and Sonoma County Museum. Iulia's first day will be October 14, 2018.

Quarterly Status Update on the Library's Goals for FY 2018-19

- Complete the facilities renovation project for Library Central Services and the Yolo County Archives and Records Center.
 - Archives and Records Center closed to the public on October 1, 2018.
 - Construction begins October 8, 2018.
 - Archives and Records Center is scheduled to reopen on May 1, 2019.
- Increase access to its services by eliminating late fines for cardholders under 18 years of age.
 - In progress with a tentative January 1, 2019 implementation date.
- Offer resources and programs reducing Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) to build resilience by educating parents and caregivers about the importance of quality early childhood education.
 - Training on resilience will be provided at a Staff Training Day on October 15, 2018.
- Offer bilingual programs and resources for parents, caregivers to promote school readiness.
 - These programs are offered at all library branches.

- Increase access to its services by adding open hours at the Esparto Regional Library.
 - This goal was completed on July 1, 2018.
- Increase access to its services by implementing the Student Success Initiative in Esparto to issue library cards to all K-12 students.
 - In progress with a tentative implementation date of January 1, 2019.
- Increase access to services by launching a new website.
 - In progress with a tentative implementation date of November 15, 2018.
- The Library will complete CEQA study, receive EIR approval, and begin construction of a new Yolo Branch Library.
 - In progress with the tentative release date of the final EIR in November 2018.
- The Library will offer an ESL Class for Caregivers at the Esparto Regional Library.
 - Implemented in September 2018.

Status Report on 2017-18 Grand Jury Report

- By October 1, 2018, all Yolo County libraries should post a code of appropriate behavior.
 - The Code of Behavior has been translated into Spanish, Russian and Chinese. The information is clearly displayed in all four languages in prominent locations at all branches.
 - Printed copies of the Code of Behavior are now available in English, Spanish, Russian and Chinese upon request at the customer service desks in all branches.
- By December 31, 2018, the Archives Coordinator should work with the County Librarian and the members of the Board of Supervisors to ensure that the proposals in the Facilities Master Plan to mitigate the environmental damage at the existing Archives building by 2025, and to replace the facility by 2035, remain on track to be implemented.
 - The renovation of the Archives and Records Center begins on October 8, 2018, with a projected completion date of April 30, 2019.
