Get Free Online Access to the *New York Times* with your Yolo County Library Card

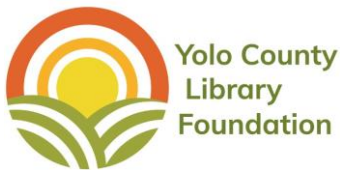
The California State Library has provided funding to make this service available, which features direct access to the *New York Times* from 1851 to the present day, including:

- Personalized access, mobile apps for phones and tablets, with customizable news feeds, and article recommendations based on topics users commonly read about.



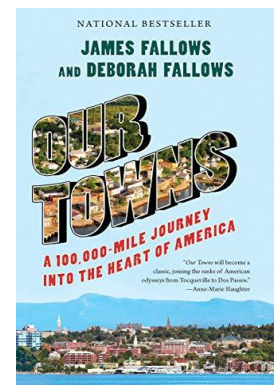

Yolo County Library Updates for FY 2018-19

The Library established the following departmental goals and strategies for the 2018-19 Fiscal Year, which have been aligned with the County’s Strategic Plan.



The Library will be updating the Board of Supervisors on its progress related to these goals on February 19, 2019. Information included in this presentation is provided below:

Goal 1: Strategic Planning	Goal 1: Status Update
Complete the facilities renovation project for Library Central Services and the Yolo County Archives and Records Center. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. This renovation project is expected to be completed by May 2019.
The County Museum Curator will make significant progress with the evaluation, accession and deaccession of the Yolo County History Collection.	In progress. It is estimated that 3,000 items in the Yolo County History Collection will be reviewed by the end of the fiscal year.
Records Center will strengthen relationships with County agencies by educating them about services offered and updating records retention schedules as needed.	In progress. Records retention schedules for the Sheriff’s Department and Clerk of the Board were updated. Staff are working with Human Resources, County Administrator’s Office and County Counsel to update their records retention schedules.
Library will collaborate with County agencies, City of Davis, Davis Joint Unified School District, and community stakeholders to explore the viability of funding, building and operating a South Davis library facility.	In progress. Several meetings have been held with city, school district and county staff to discuss need, design, function, and funding of a proposed joint-use library facility. The working title for the project is the Davis Community and Education Center.
Library will provide inclusion and diversity training for staff and stakeholders. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. Library staff will continue to provide and receive training on relevant topics to enhance the delivery of Library services.
Library will expand its work to ensure that “Everyone is Welcome at the Library” by using data analytics and targeted outreach strategies to identify services and resources that meet the needs of our diverse communities. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. Data analytics and targeted outreach strategies were used in the planning and implementation of ESL classes in Esparto, and to communicate with inactive library users to promote relevant library services, programs and resources.
Library will develop and implement strategies to enhance its succession planning efforts.	In progress. Hired an Assistant County Librarian in October 2018. Reassigned some human resource and finance functions and provided cross training for staff to ensure workflows are not delayed when personnel changes occur.
Goal 2: Thriving Residents	Goal 2: Status Update
Library will increase access to its services by eliminating late fines for cardholders under 18 years of age. (Priority Focus Area)	Completed. Late fines were eliminated for minors on January 1, 2019.
Library will expand its use of the <i>Brazelton TouchPoints</i> methodology to ensure that parents and caregivers feel confident in their roles as caregivers and form strong, resilient attachments with their children. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. Customized training, <i>Habits of Mind</i> has been developed by staff and will be provided in Spring 2019.



Library will offer resources and programs reducing Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) to build resilience by educating parents and caregivers about the importance of quality early childhood education. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. The October 2018 Staff Training Day included a presentation on ACEs and resilience by Resilient Yolo. In December 2018, Yolo County Library promoted Resilient Yolo’s “Be the One” campaign with book displays, and an online bibliography of library resources.
Library will offer bilingual programs and resources for parents, caregivers and families to promote school readiness. (Priority Focus Area)	The Library offered grant-funded ESL Class for Caregivers at Esparto Regional Library during September-November 2018. Class included free books to create home libraries.
	Bilingual Storytimes were offered at all branch libraries. Free books were provided to build home libraries. The Library’s Summer Reading Program also provided free books for participants to encourage reading at home.
Library will increase access to its services by adding open hours at the Esparto Regional Library. (Priority Focus Area)	Completed. Library added 5 more hours each week on July 1st.
Library will increase access to its services by implementing the Student Success Initiative in Esparto and Clarksburg to issue library cards to all K-12 students.	In progress. Student Success Initiative was launched in January 2019 in the Esparto Unified School District. Special library cards were created and connected to student ID numbers. Fees and fines were waived on December 31, 2018 so all students started the pilot program with full access to library resources.
Library will increase access to its services by launching a new website. (Priority Focus Area)	Completed. New website launched in November 2018. New website averages 4,500 visits each week.
Library will increase access to its services by implementing a self-service online library account registration and management system.	In progress. Online library card registration now available on website, providing instant access to the Library’s online resources. Staff is working on implementing an e-commerce option so patrons can pay fines and fees online.
Goal 3: Safe Communities	Goal 3: Status Update
Library will complete CEQA study, receive EIR approval, and begin construction of a new Yolo Branch Library. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. EIR certified by Board of Supervisors on November 6, 2018. Architectural design drawings are in progress.
Library will implement a one gigabyte broadband connection at the Clarksburg Library. (Priority Focus Area)	On hold. There has not been a vendor who can offer a broadband fiber option for the Clarksburg Library.
Goal 4: Flourishing Agriculture	Goal 4: Status Update
Library will offer an ESL class at the Esparto Regional Library that supports local agricultural workers and offers education and/or career exploration pathways at Woodland Community College. (Priority Focus Area)	Completed. First ESL class taught by Woodland Community College staff at the Esparto Regional Library took place in October 2018. A second ESL class was offered in January 2019.
Library will offer English conversation groups at rural branches to support the workforce development needs of local agricultural workers and their families. (Priority Focus Area)	In progress. ESL conversation groups are now offered in Winters and Esparto.
