Have you noticed this beautiful piano before? Many people who have been in the house many times have never noticed this beautifully carved 1880's Chickering and Sons Grand Piano. Chickering & Sons began making Pianos in 1823. Well before Steinway came on the scene Chickering & Sons was known for creating innovative and quality piano designs like this stunning square grand piano. The company was also well known for their connection to the White House. Because of their tonal quality, Jame Bucannan and

Abraham Lincoln chose Chickering Pianos and so did Franklin Pierce and Theodore Roosevelt. These piano's were sought after for their innovative musical abilities but also for their beautifully designed exteriors. This piece features delicately carved rococo legs and a uniquely wavy band underneath the keyboard. These feminized features emphasized this piece's capability to fill the house with beautiful music.

The music room also features a Ferrand Pump organ from the 1880's. Did you known Organs and Pianos use two different methods of producing sounds? One acts like a string instrument while the other acts like a woodwind. Visit the Gibson House Music Room to learn more!

These Colmount FT Opera Glasses were made in 1890 and feature a stunning Mother-of-pearl exterior and a bronze core. These stunning glasses would be an eye catching feature of any opera excursion. The 19th century was rife with optical innovation. Prior to 1823, there were only monocular opera glasses, by 1825 there were binocular glasses with a center dial to focus both eyes at once. Each pair of opera glasses was skillful crafted a team of experts: painters, goldsmiths, and others. These opera glasses would have been the perfect accessory for a Victorian woman as she dressed to the nines to attend an opera performance.
