- a) Bylaws subcommittee reported the advisory committee guidelines from the County are now on the Google drive. Most questions they had for County Counsel were answered. The City appointees do not have term limits. It is recommended that the Library Advisory Board add an at-large member so there is an odd number for voting purposes. This would require a change to the by-laws approved by the County Board of Supervisors. It was suggested that the at-large member be a volunteer from the Yolo County Archives. They discussed the possibility of creating goals for the coming year.
- b) The bylaws subcommittee created an internal document that includes the roles and responsibilities of the members and other information that will be helpful for onboarding new members. Adjunct duties will be suggested at the next meeting.

- c) Elections: Holly Bishop moved that Kristen Peacock remain Chair for another year. Esther Vasquez seconded.

8. Library Advisory Board Member Reports

- a) Holly Bishop reported Logos grossed over \$15,000 per month the last two months. On Monday the Friends of the Davis Public Library are having an event at Hunan's to thank volunteers for their hard work.
- b) Jeff Ten-Pas reported the Winters Friends raised over \$21,000 during Big Day of Giving. They continue to have book sales, and during July they sponsor a series of four music concerts in the gazebo in the park.
- c) Sharon Hallberg attended the Foundation fundraiser and shared an infographic showing all that the Foundation funded over the year.
- d) Esther Vasquez reported the Yolo Friends are working on the Yolo Car Show. Summer Reading Program and other programs are keeping community members of all ages coming to the library. They are collaborating with the Friends of Mary's Cemetery to build community.
- e) Diane Adams also attending the Foundation dinner. She is working on the LAB bylaws, was elected to the Friends of the Archives for another three-year term serving as a member.
- f) Nora Brazil reported she is also working on the LAB bylaws. On May 29 author Manvir Singh talked about shamanism at an event was attended by 77 people. Nora is working on public art for the new Walnut Park Library. She asked what preparations the library has for ICE raids. Diana will send out guidelines prepared by County Counsel.
- g) Kristen Peacock reported the WSFOL are working on updating their bylaws, is pleased the Bibliobus is visiting sites in West Sacramento, and shared Sleepaway Storytime is coming up next week, and Trucktopia was a huge success with over 400 in attendance.

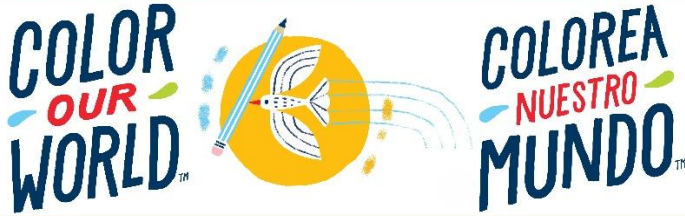

Summer Reading Program Kick-Off in West Sac: Truck Topia



Over 400 community members attended the fourth annual Truck Topia and Summer Reading Program kick-off event at the Arthur F. Turner Community Library on Saturday, May 31st. Yolo County Library Youth Services Librarian, Hope Saldivar, partnered with multiple organizations such as the Yolo County Library's new Bibliobus, the City of West Sacramento Police Department, Public Works, Waste Management, and Fire Department to ensure that families were able to tour cars and trucks of all sizes. Wonder Grove, a local non-profit children's museum provided enrichment activities for families and the Sacramento River Cat's mascot, Dinger, made a special appearance at the event to take photos as well. In addition to exploring the vehicles, engaging in hands-on activities, and learning about important public services, families also signed up to participate in this year's Summer Reading Program and left with a free book. Yolo County Library staff are eager to prepare for next year's Truck Topia and hope to include more community partners in the future so that children and families continue to have an unforgettable time at the library.

GIVE FACE 给面子 is an interdisciplinary exhibition unearthing and regrounding past, present, and future narratives of the Chinese diaspora in the Sacramento Valley in the sweeping and ever-expanding story of California.

Archival objects trace the impact of Chinese Americans on Yolo County through the things they left behind, while contemporary artworks woven throughout the exhibit call our attention to their lived experiences, intimacies, and complexities.

Using both documentation and speculation, artist Bz Zhang's work creates dialogue between Western ideas and a Chinese-diasporic cultural inheritance and offers ways to "give face" to (that is, to honor or show due respect for) Chinese ancestors in the US West.

The stories of the Chinese diaspora in Yolo County and the US West span oceans and continents, and their contributions transcend our infrastructures (from railways to agriculture) into the social and cultural fabric of our nation. Their stories are ours to carry into the shared futures we must build.

Yolo Reads/Literacy/ESL

Save the Children Grant

Nancy Pacheco, our Yolo Reads Coordinator, applied for and received grant funding from the nonprofit organization Save the Children. She and the rest of the literacy team designed a caregiver learning program to advance kindergarten readiness. They held five workshops for 35 caregivers—twice virtually at the start of the program with the remaining three workshops in person. In addition to the workshops, each program graduate

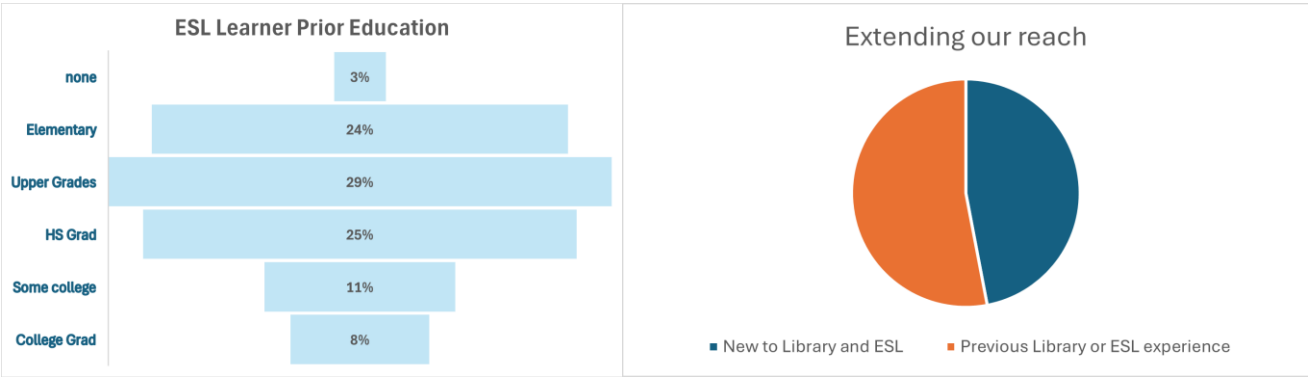
will receive a valuable collection of early learning resources, including books, Montessori materials, puppets, felt storyboards, and much more.



Partnership with YCOE

Yolo County Library, in partnership with the Yolo County Office of Education (YCOE) and the City of Davis, reached 142 individuals with classes that increased English language skills, provided access to life-changing resources, and built social capital. The grant that supports these programs started in 2022. In the first year, we reached 61 learners. Two years later, we have more than doubled that number. Partnerships are a factor in the ESL program’s success. YCOE supports classes in Esparto as part of its Adult Education program, where students learn about additional education pathways. The City of Davis supports Library ESL classes at the Montgomery Elementary School. As a result, participants are more aware of the City of Davis Parks & Rec programs, scholarships, and other family resources. Introducing hard-to-reach populations to community resources is an important outcome of Library ESL classes. Almost half of the participants have never taken an ESL class or visited a Public Library. Over 30% of participants have only had the opportunity to reach an elementary level of education.

It has been wonderful to witness ESL students build their confidence by attending class. Through their perseverance and dedication, each person has begun a new chapter with multiple, complex, beautiful characters and great dialogue. Students are building relationships and trust with members of their community, and they have support knowing that they are not alone on this journey, which once seemed lonely and difficult, and now seems, although still difficult, exciting and hopeful.
