

Soo Hoo Shee Low's Domestic Works Clarksburg Library

The Low family is one of the featured families who have objects on display at the Gibson House as a part of the Give Face 给面子 (Gěimiànzi) exhibition. Included in the exhibition are clothes that Soo Hoo Shee Low made for her family while she lived in Yolo County. Soo Hoo Shee Low was born in China in 1897 and moved to Yolo County in 1921 after marrying Keung Low, who had immigrated to Sacramento in 1914. In 1917, Keung was hired by Mary E. and Agnes Bemmerly in Zamora. The Low Family lived in Zamora with the Bemmerlys until the 1940s, when they moved to Woodland. 
Upcoming Gibson House Events
