Celebrate History

The Yolo County Archives is the official repository for Yolo County records, as well as donated materials relevant to the history of the county. In 1976 an inventory of all county-created records was conducted. Fearing that the records, some dating back to 1849, would be damaged or lost, Mary Stephens, the then Yolo County Librarian, and the Yolo County Historical Advisory Committee led the efforts to create a county archives. By 1983, funding was obtained from a federal grant, Yolo County, and many community members. The Yolo County Archives was officially founded in 1985.

The Friends of the Yolo County Archives was founded in 1986 as a non-profit organization whose purpose is to support the services and facilities of the Yolo County Archives. Please contact the Archives if you are interested in becoming a member.
